### Executive summary

The Shaping Care Together (SCT) programme is a health and care transformation programme operating across Southport, Formby and West Lancashire. This partnership programme is supported by Mersey and West Lancashire Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust (MWL), NHS Cheshire and Merseyside Integrated Care Board (ICB) and NHS Lancashire and South Cumbria ICB. The aim is to improve the quality of care for local residents by exploring new ways of delivering services and utilising staff, money and buildings to maximum effect.

The programme has now produced a newly developed Case for Change, to enable the commencement of the pre-consultation engagement to gain insight from public, patients, staff and other key stakeholders to shape the options for this transformation programme. The programme is expected to begin a programme of pre-consultation engagement in July 2024 which will include engagement and involvement with public, patients, stakeholders, partners and staff.

This report summarises the engagement with local people and stakeholders on the case for change prior to its approval at the ICB Board in July 2024.
