We can confirm that the ICB does hold part of the information you requested.

Please find our response to your questions below:

Purchase of bed capacity in the private mental health sector:

We would like to know the following information for the past 5 financial years (please break this down into 2019, 2020 etc).

The total contracted spend on private in-patient mental health beds by your ICB.

Our Response:

The ICB has a contract with its NHS provider, Lancashire and South Cumbria NHS Foundation Trust, which includes in-patient provision for all patients in Lancashire and South Cumbria. Where there is private provision for Lancashire and South Cumbria patients, it isn't paid directly by the ICB. We do make payments to the NHS provider as a contribution towards their Out of Area Placements.
