Thank you for your request dated 1 June 2024.

We can confirm that the ICB does hold part of the information you requested.

Please find our response to your questions below:

We are aware of the NHS England FASP 20 week scan guidance document. "There is no requirement to archive images of the fetal cardiac protocol views". However, we are aware there is disparity amongst NHS hospital trusts nationally when congenital heart defects are not identified at this scan. We understand some hospital trusts don't retain fetal cardiac images, some do, and some retain video clips, and some retain both. There doesn't seem to be any consistency.

We have been advised by NHS England that they do not hold the following information as it is "granular". We have been advised to approach each of the ICS/ICB's in England. We've been advised the regional CHD networks also do not hold the information.

1. Which hospital trusts within your ICS perform antenatal screening, including the 20 week fetal anomaly scan?
