| | Our Response: The criteria used by the NHS to identify “Priority Wards” in Blackpool is a cross comparison of socio-economic deprivation and the standardised emergency admission rate for ambulatory care and urgent care sensitive conditions, where specific council wards are outliers with significantly more admissions even than might be expected based on their deprivation score. These criteria, and the identification of the Priority Wards is drawn from a nationally commission data analysis completed for NHS England. The Lancashire and South Cumbria report can be found attached and which outlines the full methodology used. |
