Q1	<p>Your Question:</p> <p>Please could you let me know which Primary Care Networks have taken up the funding offer across the ICBs covered under the midlands and Lancashire commissioning support unit (All ICBs) for:</p> <p>(A1) Restore the identification, monitoring and management of all types of diabetes.</p>
	<p>Our Response:</p> <p><b>Morecambe Bay:</b> <b>West Lancashire:</b> <b>Pennine Lancashire:</b> NHS Lancashire and South Cumbria ICB do not hold this information. We are in the process of engaging with PCNs in Pennine Lancashire but don't have a list that provides this level of information.</p> <p><b>Chorley and Greater Preston:</b> Greater Preston PCN - £26,500.00 Preston North &amp; East PCN - £32,500.00 Chorley And South Ribble Network PCN - £5,500.00 Chorley Together PCN - £12,000.00 Leyland PCN - £17,500.00 South Ribble Medical Group PCN – up to £26,000 Bridgedale South Ribble PCN – up to £26,000 Chorley Central PCN – up to £26,000</p> <p><b>Blackpool, Fylde &amp; Wyre:</b> Blackpool Central PCN - Already funded through 2021/22 pilot Blackpool Central West PCN - £14,500.00 Blackpool North PCN - Already funded through 2021/22 pilot Blackpool South PCN - £16,500.00 Torentum PCN - £16,000.00</p>

Q2	<p>Your Question:</p> <p>Can you also provide clarification of where this funding has come from and the process for payment i.e. is it payment up front or dependent on the work/improvement in the 8 care processes?</p> <p>Our Response:</p> <p><b>Funding has been received by Lancashire and South Cumbria ICB (L&amp;SC ICB) from NHS England and they have managed this spend with L&amp;SC ICB passing the funds over to each PCN (Primary care network) once agreed by them. Q3	<p>Your Question:</p> <p>Please could you provide the Primary care network name and the clinical director for each PCN that have taken up this funding.</p> <p>Our Response:</p> <p><b>Please see attached.</b></p>
Q4	<p>Your Question:</p> <p>Please could you also provide information on the ICBs strategic focus on diabetes care for all ICBs covered by the Midlands and Lancashire commissioning support unit.</p> <p>Our Response:</p> <p><b>Morecambe Bay:</b>  <b>West Lancashire:</b>  <b>Pennine Lancashire:</b>  ICB and place based strategies are yet to be developed.</p> <p><b>Chorley and Greater Preston:</b>  There is a forming ICB wide diabetes programme as we move from the previous CCG led locality delivered programmes. This is aligned to the NHS England led North West Coast Clinical Network for Diabetes who coordinate and determine the strategic priorities for the ICB system. There is a focus on the entire pathway and service delivery, from prevention and early intervention all the way through to specialist clinical teams and acute based services.</p> <p><b>Blackpool, Fylde &amp; Wyre:</b>  The funding allocated by the ICB is intended to support the urgent identification and review of patients with diabetes that are at high risk of developing complications. It is also to enhance the recovery of all 8 Care Process completion rates which have declined due to COVID-19. As above, there is a forming ICB wide Diabetes programme as we move from the previous CCG led locality delivered programmes.</p>
