### Executive summary

This paper and presentation\* is coming to the ICB PIEAC group to provide an overview and assurance around the insight, co-production and insight work the maternity team are conducting across the LMNS (Local maternity and neonatal system)

In November 2023 NHS England published the Maternity and Neonatal Voices Partnership Guidance to provide advice to Integrated Care Boards and Trusts on fulfilling statutory obligations around involving people and communities in the planning, proposals and decisions regarding NHS maternity and neonatal services in England and responding to the actions and responsibilities laid out in the three-year delivery plan for maternity and neonatal services.

The LSC Local Maternity and Neonatal System (LMNS) has implemented systems and processes to enable meaningful insight, co-production and engagement with users of their services to inform targeted intervention planning in line with the 3-year delivery plan and the requirements of the equity and equality plan for maternity and neonatal services. These systems include the commissioning of HealthWatch to host our Maternity and Neonatal Voices Leads and the piloting of the Independent Maternity and Neonatal Advocate role.

The main risk to the success of these processes remains the lack of accurate datasets and analysis to inform specific and priority activity to ensure that we implement targeted interventions for the cohorts that need it most.

An options appraisal will be presented at the LMNS Executive Group in February and a preferred option will be agreed to resolve this issue.
